# Registration

What are the important dates for me to know?

- Monday, October 12th: Registration and scholarship applications open. Apply <a href="here!">here!</a>
- Monday, November 9th: Scholarship application due
- Wednesday, November 11th: Registration closes at 7:00 pm
- Friday, November 13th- Sunday, November 15th: Kallah 2020

## Can I get a refund if I cancel my registration?

Unfortunately, there will not be refunds offered for this convention. However, please know that your payment will go towards a donation to the region.

# Can I register after the registration deadline?

Late registrations will be accepted. However, we may not be able to guarantee that the convention swag will be available for late registrants.

## Why does a virtual convention cost money?

The convention fee helps cover convention supplies (programming materials, apparel, software purchased for the convention, etc), guest speakers and workshop programming, staff, a song leader, and more. A limited number of scholarships are available, and we strongly encourage you to apply.
