# Jewish Heritage

- Increase quality and frequency of Judaic programming
- Themed services to keep teens interested/able to relate
  - Pop-culture
  - Yoga & Meditation
  - Sushi Making Shabbat
- Get involved in all cultural elements of Judaism
  - Challah Bake
  - Jewish Social Activist Guest Speakers
  - Themed Shabbat Dinners (ex. BBG Sisterhood)
- Send out a monthly newsletter including information about upcoming Jewish holidays and relevant current events
- Make Shabbaton meaningful for all participants regardless of beliefs and increase attendance

# Israel Advocacy

- Increase Israel related programs
- Keep region up to date on Israeli current events (put in the monthly newsletter)
- Teach teens how to advocate for Jewish homeland
- Regionwide Israel themed dance with music, food and culture!
- Create cards and gift baskets for the IDF

# AZA & Chapter Counterparts

- In person training at beginning of year
  - Create Havdalah sets (candles, grape juice, spices), Make sure all counterparts know/have the proper prayers, Set goals for year ahead
- In person training again halfway through the year
  - Evaluate past programs, Find areas for improvement, Set more goals
- Help them find a Stand up cause and incorporate it in programming throughout the year
- All chapters should have 1-2 Jewish Heritage, Israel and Community Service programs per semester
- Have bi-weekly check-ins with each sh'l'icha
- Send a bi-weekly email to all counterparts
- Form a friendship and strong communication with all sh'lichim
- Create a list of program ideas anyone can use for their chapter

- Meet before our term starts to set goals, brainstorm & plan for the year ahead
- Weekly calls to ensure successful programming, reflect, set goals, and look for opportunities to improve
- Start planning all regional events early to ensure everything runs smoothly

# Community Service/Social Action

- Select a meaningful and interactive local Stand-up cause
- Select a global Speak-up cause
- More hands on experiences
- Receive input when selecting community service experiences to ensure all BBYO teens will be interested/invested
  - Providing school supplies for children in Detroit
  - Taking care of The Great Lakes
  - Helping families who are suffering from the Covid-19 economy collapse
- Raise money for stand-up & speak-up cause: Dinners, Events, RC, Donations, ETC
- Create an award for the chapter that has the most community service hours at RC and end of the programming year
- Volunteer at organizations other than just the selected causes
  - Friendship Circle
  - Open Hands Food Pantry & Garden
  - Arts & Scraps
  - Hadassah House
- Increase the Region's community Service hours
- Improve attendance at J-serve
